REQUEST FOR PUBLIC HEARING – OAK CREEK LANDING – ROAD EXTENSION – PUBLIC WORKS

The Council approved the request of Dave Edwards, Public Works Director, to move forward with a public hearing to add an extension of the County road, Oak Creek Landing, into the County road system.

# DELMARVA WATER TRANSPORT COMMITTEE INC. PARTICIPATION DISCUSSION

After a brief discussion with Susan Webb, Planning & Zoning Director, the Council agreed to continue its membership with Delmarva Water Transport Committee, Inc., and designated Councilman Detmer as the County representative.

#### BOARD APPOINTMENTS

The Council agreed to move forward with the process of filling the Board of Education District 2 vacancy due to the passing of Dr. Theresa Stafford. Mr. Powell provided a brief overview of the process, which includes publishing an advertisement soliciting applications and interviewing all applicants. He said the Council will appoint the board member by a majority vote at a future Council meeting.

Mr. Powell stated that information regarding appointing a board member to Cambridge Waterfront Development Inc. will be provided to him in the future. He recommended following the same procedure as filling the Board of Education vacancy.
