The Project

 Dorchester County is accepting proposals from vendors to provide professional repairing, resurfacing, and converting tennis courts to dedicated Pickleball courts in Hurlock, Maryland. The address of the property is 200 Gay Street, Hurlock, Maryland, 21643.

Scope of Work

- Repair 625 feet of cracks with Rite-Way material.
- Apply one coat of SportMaster sand-filled Flex resurfacer over the surface of the courts.
- Apply two coats of Flex Cone sand-filled paint over the playing surface.
- Strip one court for tennis with Pickleball lines, and stripping four courts for dedicated Pickleball with white lines. Lines should be installed using line masking tape that is primed to seal the edge and minimize any bleed under the tape. All playing lines will be installed with textured line paint. Playing lines should be rolled.
- For Fencing, Install 105 feet in length of 4 feet in height with black chain link with top and bottom railing.
- Contractor shall remove all materials, equipment, barrels, etc. from the site and restore the general site to an acceptable condition.

Vendor Qualifications

 Vendor shall have the wherewithal to provide services as specified, shall have proper insurance, equipment, knowledge, and employees in place to satisfactorily perform the professional repairing, resurfacing, and converting tennis courts to dedicated Pickleball courts in a timely fashion.

Tax Exemption

• The Department of Recreation and Parks, being a political subdivision, is exempt by law from applicable excise and sales tax.

Invoicing

• Contractor/Company shall provide a W-9 form. Invoices shall be paid approximately within 30 days of receipt. Partial or prepayments must be discussed prior to Invoicing. Final payments will not be made until project is completed to satisfactory.

Reservation

 The County Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids waive formalities, informalities, and technicalities therein, and to take whichever bid they determine to be in the best interest of the County considering lowest or best bid, quality of goods and work, time of delivery or completion, responsibility of bidders being considered, previous experience of bidders, or any other factors they deem appropriate.

Vendor's Insurance

- The Vendor shall purchase and maintain during the life of this contract, Workman's
 Compensation Insurance for all of his or any subcontractor's employees employed at the
 site of the work; and such Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance as shall
 protect him from claims which may arise from operations under this contract for
 personal injury (including accidental death) as well as for property damage-whether
 such operations are by himself or by any subcontractor, or by anyone directly employed
 by them.
- Public Liability Insurance shall be in the amount not less than \$500,000 for injuries, including wrongful death to any one person; and, subject to the same limit for each person, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 on account of one accident.
- Property Damage Insurance shall be in an amount not less than \$500,000 for damages on account of any one accident, and in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 for damages on account of all accidents.
- A Certificate of Insurance shall be provided as a condition of a contract award. Dorchester County shall be named as an additional insured.

Acceptance and Final Payment

When in the opinion of the vendor that he has substantially completed the work in a satisfactory manner in accordance with the terms of the contract, the vendor shall submit in writing to the County a request for a determination that the project is complete and suitable for its intended use. They County shall make an inspection of the entire project and shall provide in writing to the Contractor a finding if the project is substantially complete and if so a final punch list of the remaining work to be completed for final completion.

- As a condition for final payment, the vendor shall supply the following:
 - A. Release of Liens-The vendor shall deliver (in a form satisfactory to the County) a written report to the effect that all bills for labor, materials, and supplies have been paid or satisfactorily secured.
 - B. Consent of Surety-Projects bonded by a surety bond will require written Consent of Surety for Final Payment.
